We will be showing **End of the Spear**, which recounts the true story of five missionaries who attempted to evangelise the Waodani people in the Ecuadorian jungle and were martyred in doing so. The film tells the story from the perspective of Steve Saint, the son of Nate Saint, one of the missionaries who lost their lives, and also from the perspective of Mincayani, one of the tribesmen who killed the missionaries. The two eventually form a bond which continues to this day.


We will also be hosting a **follow-up meeting on Sunday 11th September at 7:00pm** to discuss any issues the film may raise.


This is intended as an event we can invite our family and friends along to, and hopefully through warm invitation and lots of prayer, it will be a success.
